### **A Status Survey of Vocation and Academic Studies**

of the Tafnit for Matriculation Program - Last Hurdle Subject graduates who participated in the program during 11<sup>th</sup> or 12<sup>th</sup> grade throughout 2007-2011,

in Southern high schools in which the program was operated in partnership with the Rosalinde And Arthur Gilbert Foundation



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#### Part A: Introduction - Goal, Population and Method

The Tafnit for Matriculation Program - Last Hurdle Subject, is one of the Yeholot Association's programs (established by the Rashi Foundation). The program accepts 11<sup>th</sup> and/or 12<sup>th</sup> graders, who according to the schools, will fail in one (up to two) matriculation subjects (or have already failed in that subject's matriculation exam). This subject constitutes a Last Hurdle towards reaching a matriculation certificate for these students. With the goal of helping the students achieve a matriculation certificate at the end of 12<sup>th</sup> grade in mind, the program operates and helps students succeed in their Last Hurdle subject exam. The students are located through the schools' dynamic mapping method, prior to the program. The program's staff, which is consisted of teachers in the schools in which the program operates, activate the Yeholot Association's enhanced learning method, after receiving training and pedagogical support from the program experts.

The Method's activation, provides a response to two main independent variables which explain the schools' failure (variables from inside and outside the school): Changing the students' perception and awareness of their abilities and enhanced learning due to the need to close gaps. It includes guidelines and activity elements such as:

\* Very challenging objectives that are time limited \* Leader and leadership \* Holistic motivational processes before and during the process \* Decisiveness and result-oriented thinking \* Change as a norm \* Breaking routine \* Changing the surroundings \* Addressing emotional needs \* Team work \* Continuous supervision over every students' results \* Hourly detailed learning plan \* Chain of academic successes \* Dynamic mapping \* Multiple success opportunities \* Less is more - focusing on a small number of subjects \* Parent partnership \* Activities in the evening activity and some outside of school and more.

The Gilbert Foundation has been an important partner in the Tafnit for Matriculation Program (Last Hurdle subject), since 2004 in dozens of Southern schools, with over 1,500 high school students participating, between the years 2004-2011.

#### A.1. The Goal of the Survey:

The current survey, which is presented to the Gilbert Foundation following their request, presents vocation and academic studies supervision and examination results of the program participants who completed 12<sup>th</sup> grade. This report follows a report that was published in 2009 which examined the status of the students throughout the years 2004-2007.

#### A.2. Population:

This survey will refer to the Tafnit for Matriculation Program (Last Hurdle subject), participants from Southern schools during 2007-2011, up to four and half years since completing 12<sup>th</sup> grade, in accordance with survey findings from January-February 2012.

From among the 1,074 students who participated in the Tafnit for Matriculation Program (Last Hurdle subject), in partnership with the Gilbert Foundation, we surveyed 950 (88.5%). The results will refer to the survey participants.

#### A.3. Collecting and Examining Information

- a. We collected and coordinated details of the towns, schools and students who participated in the program during 2007-2011.
- b. We created an objective questionnaire that included specific questions about vocation status / academic studies.
- c. We conducted a telephone survey with the Tafnit for Matriculation Program (Last Hurdle subject) participants from 2007-2011. The survey took place throughout February 2012, during which all of the survey participants were required to answer the questionnaire by telephone. Their answers constitute the basic data that we processed for this report.
- d. The data collected from 582 Bedouin participants was collected by the program coordinators who work with the Bedouin schools. They interviewed the participants directly. In addition, they used information given by the school principals and teachers who have continuous contact with the students and are involved in their lives even after the program completion.
- e. The participants' vocation or academic status was sorted according to the following status definition:
- **1. Still in high school:** participants who were still in 12<sup>th</sup> grade while answering the survey.
- **2. Before IDF service:** participants who had a few weeks until their IDF enlistment when answering the survey.
- **3. Volunteering in National/Civil service:** participants who were volunteering for their National/Civil service when answering the survey.
- **4. Serving in the IDF:** participants serving their IDF service when answering the survey.
- **5. During their academic/pre-academic studies:** participants who were studying (university/college) for a degree or in a pre-academic school to improve matriculation/psychometric exams, when answering the survey.
- **6. Completed degree or certificate studies:** participants who completed their academic studies when answering the survey (university/college).
- **7. Academics before IDF service:** participants who completed certificate studies and were serving their IDF service when answering the survey.
- **8. Academic acceptance process:** participants who had submitted their academic candidacy (university/college) and were waiting for a response when answering the survey.
- **9. On holiday/at home:** participants who were on holiday or were neither working nor studying when answering the survey.
- **10. Working:** participants who were working when answering the survey.



#### Part B: Main Findings:

- **B.1.** Approximately 95% of the 1,074 participants in the Tafnit for Matriculation Program (Last Hurdle subject), in partnership with the Gilbert Foundation, succeeded in their Last Hurdle subject matriculation exam.
- **B.2.** 34.5% of the survey participants who took part in the Tafnit for Matriculation Program (Last Hurdle subject), in partnership with the Gilbert Foundation during 2007-2011 (some of the participants are still in the 12<sup>th</sup> grade and some completed 12<sup>th</sup> grade up to 4.5 years ago), reported that they are studying academic studies or have completed their degree/certificate studies or are in their acceptance process.
- **B.3.** 28.4% of the survey participants who took part in the Tafnit for Matriculation Program (Last Hurdle subject), in partnership with the Gilbert Foundation during 2007-2011 (some of the participants are still in the 12<sup>th</sup> grade and some completed 12<sup>th</sup> grade up to 4.5 years ago), reported that they are studying academic studies or have completed their degree/certificate studies.
  - B.4. <u>44.8% of the survey participants who took part in the Joint project with the Gilbert Foundation during 2007 (3.5-4.5 years since completing 12<sup>th</sup> grade) reported that are studying academic studies or have completed their degree/certificate studies or are in their acceptance process.</u>

#### Main Findings relating to the Jewish Participants

- **B.5.** 12.0% of the survey's Jewish participants who took part in the Tafnit for Matriculation Program (Last Hurdle subject), in partnership with the Gilbert Foundation during 2007-2011 (some of the participants are still in the 12<sup>th</sup> grade and some completed 12<sup>th</sup> grade up to 4.5 years ago), reported that they are studying in academic studies or have completed their degree/certificate studies or are in their acceptance process.
- **B.6.** 12.0% of the survey's Jewish participants who took part in the Tafnit for Matriculation Program (Last Hurdle subject), in partnership with the Gilbert Foundation during 2007-2011 (some of the participants are still in the 12<sup>th</sup> grade and some completed 12<sup>th</sup> grade up to 4.5 years ago), reported that they are studying academic studies or have completed their degree/certificate studies.
- B.7. <u>56.0% of the survey's Jewish participants who took part in the Tafnit for Matriculation Program (Last Hurdle subject), in partnership with the Gilbert Foundation during 2007-2011, reported that they are still serving in the IDF / National / Civil service.</u>
- 8.7% others are still in 12<sup>th</sup> grade, 5.2% others are soon to be enlisted in the army.
- 3.0% others aren't working and 14.9% are working.
- **B.8.** The explanation for the low rate of Jewish participants who are in academic studies: 56.0%- are serving in the IDF or volunteering in their National service and 8.7% others are still in 12<sup>th</sup> grade.
- **B.9.** 33.3% of the survey's Jewish participants who took part in the Tafnit for Matriculation Program (Last Hurdle subject), in partnership with the Gilbert Foundation in 2007 (3.5-4.5 years since completing 12<sup>th</sup> grade), reported that they are studying in academic studies or have completed their degree/certificate studies or are in their acceptance process.

#### Main Findings relating to the Bedouin Participants

**B.10.** 48.8% of the survey's Bedouin participants who took part in the Tafnit for Matriculation Program (Last Hurdle subject), in partnership with the Gilbert Foundation during 2007-2011 (some of the participants are still in the 12<sup>th</sup> grade and some completed 12<sup>th</sup> grade up to 4.5 years ago), reported that they are studying academic studies or have completed their degree/certificate studies or are in their acceptance process.



- **B.11.** 38.8% of the survey's Bedouin participants who took part in the Tafnit for Matriculation Program (Last Hurdle subject), in partnership with the Gilbert Foundation during 2007-2011 (some of the participants are still in the 12<sup>th</sup> grade and some completed 12<sup>th</sup> grade up to 4.5 years ago), reported that they are studying academic studies or have completed their degree/certificate studies. 5.2% others are still in the 12<sup>th</sup> grade. 24.9% others aren't working (23.5% women, 1.4% men). 20.4% others are working.
- **B.12.** 49.6% of the survey's Bedouin participants who took part in the Tafnit for Matriculation Program (Last Hurdle subject), in partnership with the Gilbert Foundation in 2007 (3.5-4.5 years since completing 12<sup>th</sup> grade), reported that they are studying academic studies or have completed their degree/certificate studies or are in their acceptance process.

# In Israel, 44.5% of those completing 12<sup>th</sup> grade turn to academic studies within 8 years<sup>1</sup>

(Hebrew Education - 47.8%, Arab Education - 28.3%)<sup>2</sup>




#### Part C: Findings of All Participants throughout 2007-2011:

- **C.1.** The Program (in partnership with the Gilbert Foundation) Participants' Rate of Success in Matriculation Exams. In the joint activities with the Gilbert Foundation in the Tafnit for Matriculation Program (Last Hurdle subject) during 2007-2011, 1,074 students from the South participated and approximately 95% of those who began the program succeeded in their Last Hurdle subject's matriculation exam. Please note the following details:
  - 2007 225 participants- 92% success.
  - 2008 205 participants- 95% success.
  - 2009 222 participants- 94% success.
  - 2010 222 participants- 99% success.
  - 2011 200 participants- 95% success.



C.2. The Program (in partnership with the Gilbert Foundation) Participants' from 2007-2011, Current Vocation Status<sup>3</sup>: following is the vocation status distribution of the 950 survey participants:

- 6.5% still in high school.
- 2.0% soon to be enlisted into the IDF.
- 2.8% volunteering in their National/Civil service.
- 19.3% serving in the IDF.
- 34.5% studying in academic or pre-academic studies or in their acceptance process.
- 28.4% studying or have completed their degree or certificate studies.
- 18.3% working. 16.4% not working.

### C.3. The Program (in partnership with the Gilbert Foundation) Jewish Participants' from 2007-2011, Current Vocation Status:

- 8.7% Still in high school.
- 5.2% soon to be enlisted into the IDF.
- 6.3% volunteering in their National/Civil service. 49.7% serving in the IDF.
- 12% studying academic or pre-academic studies or in their acceptance process.
- 12% studying or have completed their degree or certificate studies.
- 14.9%- working. 3% not working.

### C.4. The Program (in partnership with the Gilbert Foundation) Bedouin Participants' from 2007-2011, Current Vocation Status:

- 5.2% Still in high school.
- 0% soon to be enlisted into the IDF. 0%- serving in the IDF.
- 0.7% volunteering in their National/Civil service.
- 48.8% studying academic or pre-academic studies or in their acceptance process.
- 38.8% studying or have completed their degree or certificate studies.
- 20.4% working. 24.9% not working.







- The 2007 program participants (3.5-4.5 years after 12<sup>th</sup> grade) 44.8%.
- The 2008 program participants (2.5-3.5 years after 12<sup>th</sup> grade) 43.7%.
- The 2009 program participants (1.5-2.5 years after 12<sup>th</sup> grade) 36.2%.
- The 2010 program participants (0.5-1.5 years after 12<sup>th</sup> grade) 33.8%
- The 2011 program participants (Some still in 12th grade up to 0.5 years after 12th grade) -15.5%.

- The 2007 program participants (3.5-4.5 years after 12<sup>th</sup> grade) 33.9%.

- The 2009 program participants (1.5-2.5 years after 12<sup>th</sup> grade) 35.2%. The 2010 program participants (0.5-1.5 years after 12<sup>th</sup> grade) 23.9%.
- The 2011 program participants (Some still in 12<sup>th</sup> grade up to 0.5 years after 12<sup>th</sup> grade) -15.5%.





#### Part D:

#### Findings about All Participants' Vocation Status according to Participation Year:

**D.1. The 2007 Program Participants' Current Status (completed 12<sup>th</sup> grade 3.5-4.5 years ago):** 225 11<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> graders participated in the 2007 program, among which 183 participated in the survey (81.3%). Following is the survey participants' vocation status distribution:

- 0% still in high school.
- 0% soon to be enlisted into the IDF.
- 3.8% volunteering in their National/Civil service.
- 4.4% serving in the IDF.
- 44.8% <u>studying academic studies or in their acceptance process or completed</u> their academic degree/certificate studies.
- 33.9% studying or have completed their degree or certificate studies.
- 21.9% on holiday or aren't working (most are Bedouin women 19.1%).
- 25.1% working.
